One Maths, English, Phonics and foundation task should be completed every day. Additionally, please also ensure that you read with your child every day.

Say, read then write the Phase 3 'tricky words' was, you, they, my, by, all, are, sure, and pure and practise all the 'tricky words' learnt in the Autumn term in your Reading Record.</p> |

Let your parent know what is happening on the page. Look for words in items around the home – cereal boxes, tins of food, newspapers, magazines for example.</p> |
