This home learning letter provides your child with learning activities from various areas of the curriculum to complete at home. Each area of learning will have a link which you can use to access the work. Please ensure the maths and English tasks are completed in the morning and the foundation activities (including science and topic) in the afternoon, as it would be in school. Please ensure your child reads every day.

This is an instructions unit designed to help your child use the appropriate vocabulary to write instructions to guide someone to do something accurately. Each daily lesson provides a learning video to follow and an activity to complete. Watch the video in full prior to completing the task. Start at lesson 1 and continue to work your way through the lessons each day.
<b>Phonics</b> (x 15 minutes per day)	Login to phonics play <a href="https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/">https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/</a> and select a phase 5 activity to play. You can also practise tricky words. If you find this hard, you can go over phase 3 and 4 activities also. If your child is no longer reviewing previously learnt sounds, please spend 15 minutes reading and then discuss the text. What happened? Why did the characters act the way they did? What do you think will happen next?
<b>Maths</b> (x 50 minutes per day)	<a href="#">Practise your number bonds to 10 and 20 every day. Count in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s forwards and back.</a> In mathematics we would like you to complete daily lessons using Oak National Academy. Use the link below to access these lessons. Complete one lesson per day – each lesson provided has a teaching video, main activity, and the answers so you can check your own work. There are some additional tasks which you may wish to try as well. <b>Reading For Pleasure</b> (x 20 minutes per day)	Read a book of your choice, discussing it with an adult. See the above Phonics section for more information.

<b>(x 30 minutes per day)</b>	There are lots of other cosmic yoga videos to choose from too. Continue to practise throwing and catching skills.
<b>Independent Play (60 mins per day)</b>	Play allows children to use their creativity while developing their imagination, dexterity, and physical, cognitive, and emotional strength. Play is important to healthy brain development. It is through play that children at a very early age engage and interact in the world around them. So remember to get your toys out and play for at least an hour a day!
